This semester, our chapter was recognized for our excellence in several areas of operation, including programming, brotherhood, and standards and accountability.

At the 2023 Student Choice Awards, our chapter was recognized alongside the brothers of Kappa Alpha Psi, Fraternity Inc. for Outstanding Greek Collaboration of the Year for our Cookies & Cocoa philanthropy event.

At the 2023 Ritter Awards, our chapter was awarded the Excellence in Brotherhood award for our strong member development program. This is the third year in a row that our chapter has received a Ritter Award as we took home the 2021 and 2022 awards for Excellence in Scholarship. Isaiah Morgan, our Vice President of Recruitment, was also named Greek New Member of the Year out of all 36 Greek chapters at MSU.

In addition to these campus honors, our chapter was also presented with an Excelsior Award for Standards and Accountability from Sigma Phi Epsilon Headquarters in April of this year. This award recognized the efforts made by multiple executive boards and Chaplains to better serve our members and help them remain accountable in their growth as members.

This average earned us a spot in the top three chapters out of all 17 Interfraternity Council chapters at Mississippi State. With this semester's placement, our chapter has now had 12 straight semesters in the top five. Our new member GPA this semester was a 3.25, which was the second highest new member GPA out of all 17 chapters. Our chapter has also ranked in the top five for average new member GPA for the past six consecutive semesters.
